# Special notes on OLED monitors

The following are normal with the OLED monitor and do not indicate a problem.

- Due to the nature of the fluorescent light, the screen may flicker during initial use. Turn
  off the power switch and then turn it on again to make sure the flicker disappears.
- You may find slightly uneven brightness on the screen depending on the desktop pattern you use.
- The OLED screen has 99.99% or more effective pixels. It may include blemishes of 0.01% or less such as a missing pixel or a pixel lit all the time.
- Due to the nature of the OLED screen, an afterimage of the previous screen may remain
  after switching the image, when the same image is displayed for hours. In this case, the
  screen is recovered slowly by changing the image or turning off the power switch for a
  few hours.

# Cleaning your monitor

Please carefully follow these guidelines when cleaning the monitor:

- Always unplug the monitor before cleaning.
- Use a soft cloth to wipe the screen and cabinet front and sides.

# Accessibility

Be sure that the power outlet you plug the power cord into is easily accessible and located as close to the equipment operator as possible. When you need to disconnect power from the equipment, be sure to unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet.

#### Safe listening

To protect your hearing, follow these instructions.

- Gradually increase the volume until you can hear it clearly and comfortably and without distortion.

# Image Retention Refresh

To reduces the risk of image retention occurrence, if the monitor has been in use for Image Retention Refresh more than 4 hours, Image Retention Refresh, will start automatically after the monitor is turned off. You can also start Image Retention Refresh manually via OSD menu.


When Image Retention Refresh process begins, the monitor will display warning message the power LED starts flashing blue and amber light alternately.

When the power LED lights off, this indicates the Image Retention Refresh process is complete, the duration of the Image Retention Refresh is around 5 minutes.



**Note: •** During Image Retention Refresh process don't turn off monitor and don't unplug the power.

 Image Retention Refresh can be pressed only when the screen has been used for than 4 hours, before the time is exceeded it will be grayed out.





# Tips and information for comfortable use

- using a display visor, such as a piece of cardboard extended from the display's top front edge
- Avoid adjusting your display to an awkward viewing angle.
- Avoid looking at bright light sources, such as open windows, for extended periods of time.

- Take short breaks regularly and often.
- · Perform some stretching exercises.
- Breathe fresh air as often as possible.

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



 Unpack the box. Take out the Styrofoam side by side and set flat on the desktop.




2. Take the Styrofoam with display out of the box.

4. Install the stand onto the base and fasten it with the thumb screw from the bottom of the base.




5. Attach the base of step 4 to the quick release notch of the OLED monitor securely.

 Connect the VESA Adapter Mounting 2. Connect the monitor onto the wall. Kit with screws.



#### SCREEN POSITION ADJUSTMENT

To optimize the viewing position, you can adjust the monitor tilt by using both of your hands to hold the edges of the monitor. The monitor can be adjusted to 20 degrees up or 5 degrees down.

- Super Sharpness technology can simulate high-resolution images by boosting the pixel density of the original source. It can make images sharper and clear.





  - Scope Size: Choose scope size (Small, Middle, Large), default is Middle.
  - · Scope with Night Vision: To filter R&B channel.

10. Timer: OSD Shows the timer on monitor top-left side.



Note: 1. If user select 30 mins, OSD will countdown the timer from 30:00 to 00:00.

2. When the Timer Set On, the Aim Point and Refresh Rate Num is gray out.

#### **OSD**



- 1. Press the MENU key to open the OSD.
- Using the ▲/▼ button, select System from the OSD. Then navigate to the setting you





- 11. HDMI Black Level: You can select the level of blackness under HDMI source.
- 12. Quick Start Mode: Select Off or On. The default is "Off". Turn on to speed up boot speed.
- 13. USB Port Select: Set the USB port type to C-Type or B-Type or Auto.
- 14. DSC:The default is "On", Support DP&HDMI & DP ALT has DSC Function.



Note: 1. DSC = "On" is Default

Support DP, DP ALT & HDMI.

All can support max resolution must refer to the "Max Refresh Rate".

2. DSC = "Off"

For some devices such as mobile phones, DSC needs to be set to Off to display properly.

Resolutions that can be supported will depend on the capabilities of the graphics card, and may not be able to display 5120X1440@240Hz.

15. Power-off USB Charge: Select "On" to supply power to the USB port and select "Off" to turn on DC off/Power saving mode.



Note: 1. To comply with international energy standards, this display is currently set to power saving mode, which disables certain functions when display is put to sleep (standby) and has power off (DC off) status.

- 2. Switching "Power-off USB Charge" to "On" enables all display functions and may consume more power.
- 3. The USB port must be connected according to this picture before it can be used for service. (For example, read Mac Address/SN)



16. Image Retention Refresh: To reduces the risk of image retention occurrence, if the monitor has been in use for Image Retention Refresh more than 4 hours, Image Retention Refresh, will start automatically after the monitor is turned off. You can also start Image Retention Refresh manually via OSD menu. When Image Retention Refresh process begins, the monitor will display warning message the power LED starts flashing blue and amber light alternately. When the power LED lights off, this indicates the Image Retention Refresh process is complete, the duration of the Image Retention Refresh is around 5 minutes.



Note: During Image Retention Refresh process don't turn off monitor and don't unplug the power.
